It's a great idea to choose one of these methods to go deeper and/or help you understand the passages even more!

SWEDISH METHOD

READ THE TEXT

- · Read the text out loud
- Let each person read on their own for 5-8 minutes, writing down something in each of the following four categories.

DISCUSS THE TEXT

Ask what everyone found in each category. Always discuss one category fully before moving on to the next.



Light bulb:

Anything that shines out in the passage and draws attention; it can be something important, or something that particularly strikes the reader.



Question mark:

Anything that is hard to understand; something the reader would like to be able to ask the author about.



Heart:

The central idea of the passage; the main message intended by the author for their original readers.



Arrow:

Anything that applies to the reader's life; how we should respond in light of the text.

PRAY THE TEXT

Have everyone go around and say a short prayer in light of the text. This could be praying that God helps us respond in the way the text asks us to or perhaps worshipping God for what we have learned in the text.

COMA METHOD

Context

- Who is the audience of this passage? What are the circumstances surrounding it?
- What comes right before and after this passage? Are there logical connections to our passage?
- Where is this passage in relation to the Redemptive Story? (Creation, Fall, Redemption, Re-creation)

Observation

- What are the main characters, elements, transitions (ex. Because, for, but, and), and tone?
- What are the main statements? Are there any elements repeated?
- Are there any surprising or confusing aspects? Are there any unique details?
- What are the responses and emotions in the passage?

Meaning

- What questions do you have about the passage?
- How would you sum up the meaning and purpose of this passage in your own words?
- What does this passage teach me about God? About me?
 About the world?
- How does this passage relate to Jesus and the Gospel?

Application

- HEAD: Is there a truth to know and believe in? Is there a way to know God more?
- HEART: How do the truths of this text inspire gratitude, humility, affection, and/or joy in Christ?
- HANDS: Is there any example to follow or NOT follow? Is there a sin to confess? Is there a way I can respond in light of this passage?

S.P.E.C.K.A.

SPECKA is a highly participatory Bible study process that is focused on the application of the biblical truths discovered during the study.

Here's how it works:

READ SCRIPTURE

Select a passage to study that is 10 to 12 verses or a natural group of verses, e.g., a parable. Make sure everyone has a copy of the Bible. Have someone read the passage aloud. After the passage has been read ask, "Are there any questions? Is there anything that you did not understand?"

DISCUSS SCRIPTURE

The facilitator of the group will ask the SPECKA questions and moderate the discussion. Be sure to provide enough time for people to think as they look at the passage and respond to each SPECKA question. It is possible that one or more of the SPECKA questions cannot be answered in a particular passage. If this is the case, just move on to the next question.

APPLY SCRIPTURE

As critical as it is that we know what God's Word says, it is just as critical that we obey what God's Word tells us to do. Be sure to allow ample time for discussing the practical application of the passage studied.

S.P.E.C.K.A. METHOD

- **S** Any **SIN** to avoid or confess?
- P Any **PROMISES** or **PROPHECIES** made or fulfilled?
- **E** Any **good EXAMPLES** to follow or **bad EXAMPLES** to avoid?
- **C** Any **COMMANDS** to obey?
- K Any **KNOWLEDGE** about who God is or how He works?
- A What **APPLICATION** to practice personally?
